
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SA VINYA ROUTE

The Sa Vinya route is located to the south-east of the Galatzó estate, and links the houses of the old farmstead with an area of former agricultural land that borders the neighbouring s'Alqueria estate, Sa Vinya.

This easy linear walk covering a little over 8 km is well signposted and suitable for all walkers. The route covers the typical agricultural areas you might find on a mountain estate, and is dotted with ethnographic sites linked to agricultural, livestock and forestry activities, above all in the area around the Es Tramuntanal, Font des Obis and Sa Vinya sites, where there are terraces, hydraulic systems, charcoal kilns, labourers' huts, and even a bread oven. This route also features three archaeological sites from the Talayotic period, which reflect the different settlement strategies employed in the local area at that time. Hikers are offered a chance to enjoy the flora and fauna characteristic of the Serra de Tramuntana – in particular, Mallorcan goats and booted eagles – as they stroll through holm oak, pine and rock roses.

The route ends at an elevation of 425 m at the top of the valley which, protected by the mountain of Puig de Sa Panada, gives views over the croplands of the old farmstead. At this point, we are treated to views of the Serra de Tramuntana, with the peaks of Puig de Galatzó and Mola de s'Esclop flanking the Galatzó valley.



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
